


## Making Curls using a Silicon Mat



## Steps:

- 1. Place Original Magic gel onto your lace mat (there is no need to grease the mat)
- 2. Scrape with a palette knife or scraper.
- 3. Make sure you cover the whole mat.
- 4. If there are any holes they need to be filled as once dry they will create weak spots in your lace, making it harder to remove from the mat without tearing.
- 5. Using a plastic scraper or card scraper (provided with Deco Magic products). Scrape the excess gel off the lace mat.
- 6. Do this in one direction.
- 7. Repeat the above step in the opposite direction.
- 8. This is how your lace mat should look. You can leave on the bench to dry or place in the oven at 65° or dehydrator for a quicker result.
- 9. Remove from oven/dehydrator or bench and place on a plastic sheet.
- 10. Slowly release the dry lace from the mat.
- 11. Keep slowly pulling the lace from the mat.
- 12. If you are concerned it is going to break, flip the mat over, hold the lace and slowly pull the mat from the lace.
- 13. This is how your lace should look.
- 14. Using scissors, cut the lace into strips to the thickness you require.
- 15. With this mat I have managed to make three strips. Leave on the plastic sheet.
- 16. Take a piping bag with Original Magic in (using a no.0 or 1 size Loyal tube) and pipe a straight line either side where you cut the strips.
- 17. Repeat the process for all the strips.
- 18. This is how your strips should look. Now put in an oven at 65° or dehydrator or leave to dry.
- 19. Once dry, peel the strips off the plastic with a knife.



## Making Curls using a Silicon Mat

- 20. The lace pieces should still be flexible.
- 21. Wrap these strips over a pen or dowel to form a curl shape.
- 22. Leave to dry.
- 23. Once dry, remove curls from the pen or dowel.
- 24. This is how they should look and should be hard enough to handle.
